



2:10 Mission Fund Awards

Fife Presbytery's 2:10 Mission Fund 2022 will provide small grants up to £2,500 and large grants up to £10,000 to support the development of local mission initiatives and projects.

"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." - Ephesians 2:10

I'm delighted to share with you the results from Fife Presbytery's 2:10 Mission Fund 2022! The 2:10 Mission Fund was designed to support and develop mission initiatives across Fife Presbytery, by: putting our money where our mission is!

The 2022 Mission Fund opened in September, with £40k available to distribute before the end of the year, or otherwise lost to Presbytery.

Our priorities are to fund mission initiatives that either:

- ***Developed mission through new worshipping communities*** OR
- ***Engaged and attracted those under 40 including children and young people***

These reflected goals identified as part of our Presbytery Strategy.

Once again there was a high number of excellent applications from across Presbytery. This meant that shortlisting was challenging and a number of otherwise good applications were not taken forward.
